Corona Virus Pandemic – Public Masses

Our Parish Advisory Committee met on Tuesday evening in Louisburgh Church to discuss the reopening of Churches for public worship. The committee remain of the opinion that it is not advisable to return to public worship yet, due to the fact that the number of infections is again rising and reports that the virus is again spreading with the R number above 1.

In addition, the results of our parish survey found that over 65% of parishioners would prefer to wait until autumn to return to public worship.

This time of year, with the influx of visitors, we would usually have up to 800 people attend the three weekend Masses in the parish. It would be difficult to manage this with the current physical distancing requirements and the absolute maximum limit of 50 for indoor activities.

The Churches will continue to open daily for private prayer from 12.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m.

First Holy Communion, as already arranged, will continue at daily Masses, reserved for family. We will review the situation at the next meeting on 28 July, with the aim of a trial opening on 09 August, but this is very dependent on public health advice.

There is no obligation to attend Mass at present. The committee continue to make decisions in the interests of the safety of all parishioners, staff, and volunteers in the Kilgeever parish. We thank everyone for their cooperation.

Lighting Candles in Church.

The electronic votive candle shrine is operational in Killeen Church. Please ensure you use the hand sanitiser before you use it.

Due to the highly flammable nature of hand sanitiser the votive candle shrine in Louisburgh church is not in use at present. Even with warning signs there have been reports of incidents in different places with people's hands catching fire while lighting candles.

An electronic votive candle shrine will be provided in the near future to accommodate those who wish to 'light a candle', so they can do so safely.

Re-opening of Churches:

Attending Mass will be a very different experience from the past. Please exercise patience and have realistic expectations.

Only very limited numbers of people will be able to attend any given Mass due to physical distancing guidelines.

- Church will open 30 minutes before Mass time.
- If necessary people will wait outside in a queue, observing physical distancing, 2 metre intervals to be marked.
- On entry, and exit, hands must be sanitised;
- You will be directed to a seat by a steward; please remain in that seat during Mass; movement inside the church is to be limited as much as possible.
- The church will be filled row by row, from the top down. Once full to the allowed numbers people may wait outside, observing physical distancing. There are loudspeakers outside the main doors of both churches. If people wish to wait in their cars they can follow the Mass via the parish website on a smartphone.
- The wearing of a face covering is to become mandatory while indoors with other people in a public area. You are asked to wear a face covering while at Mass. Your mask protects others.
- The gallery will only be available to a musician and two or three singers.
- There will be a basket at the porch for the weekly collection envelopes.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass, after which people will exit the church. People outside will then be invited to come into the church for Holy Communion.
- Eucharistic ministers will sanitise their hands before and after giving out Holy Communion, as they have done for many years in the parish. They will now also wear masks.
- Holy Communion will be given only into your hand; please extend your arm and hold your hand as flat and steady as possible
- Newsletters will be available as you exit the church.
- Once outside the church people will be asked to go immediately to their cars / walk home and not gather outside.

Sunday Mass:

- There is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass.
- People over 70 years of age, and those with a health issue, are highly recommended not to attend places where numbers of people meet for any length of time, especially indoors.

Pastoral Centre, Louisburgh: For at least the immediate future it will not be possible to rent rooms for meetings etc. in the Pastoral Centre. The level of sanitisation required before and after such short term rentals make it practically and financially unviable.

The centre will continue to be used for parish based meetings, e.g. the parish pastoral council, when it is necessary and safe to do so.
