Corona Virus Safeguards in Church

Attending Mass is now a very different experience from the past. Please exercise patience and have realistic expectations.

Only very limited numbers of people will be able to attend any given Mass due to physical distancing guidelines.

- **There is no obligation on anybody to attend Sunday Mass.**
- **People over 70 years of age, and those with a health issue, are highly recommended not to attend places where numbers of people meet for any length of time, especially indoors.**
- **Absolute Maximum Capacity of either church is 50 People, (this includes priest, sacristan, musicians, ushers, etc), even with members from the same household sitting together.**
- **Physical Distancing: If you live in the same house please share the same seat, otherwise stay 2 metres apart, this means two people (one at each end) in a longer seat or one person only in a shorter seat.**
- **Please follow the directions of the Stewards to ensure the health and safety of everybody**

With the incidence of corona virus again rising it is vital that we continue to follow the guidelines given by the public health authorities; especially by limiting social contacts, keeping the physical distancing, washing hands and wearing a face mask when indoors with a group of people.

Protect our Environment:

"Irish Water have asked landowners in Louisburgh to take care when using pesticides after a chemical used to treat weeds was found in the local water supply.

An exceedance of the pesticide MCPA was detected in the public drinking water supply in Louisburgh following routine sampling earlier this month. MCPA is a commonly used herbicide present in many products used to control thistles, docks and rushes.

The Louisburgh water supply comes from the Bunnahowan River, which is vulnerable to contamination from land and animal run-off. While the levels detected do not represent a threat to human health, Irish Water is asking users of pesticide products in the Bunnahowan River catchment to consider the vulnerability of the water supplies to pesticide contamination and the importance of this supply to the local community. Dr. Pat O'Sullivan, Irish Water's Regional Drinking Water Compliance Specialist said: "While the HSE has advised that the levels seen do not represent a threat to public health, it is however undesirable, and it is therefore imperative that users of pesticides are mindful of best practice when spraying their lands."
