Monthly Calls: The monthly calls to the sick and housebound by Fr Long were suspended due to the corona virus pandemic. The advice is still to limit visits to multiple homes as much as possible, especially to those who may be vulnerable. However, if anybody wishes Fr Long to visit, or to receive Holy Communion or the sacrament of the sick, please phone 66198 and arrangements will be made for an individual visit, taking all advised precautions.

Family members may be appointed as special Eucharistic ministers to bring Holy Communion to an elderly or ill family member.

Corona Virus Safeguards in Church

Attending Mass is now a very different experience from the past. Please exercise patience and have realistic expectations.

Only very limited numbers of people will be able to attend any given Mass due to physical distancing guidelines.

- *There is no obligation on anybody to attend Sunday Mass.*
- *People over 70 years of age, and those with a health issue, are highly recommended not to attend places where numbers of people meet for any length of time, especially indoors.*
- *Absolute Maximum Capacity of either church is 50 People, (this includes priest, sacristan, musicians, ushers, etc), even with members from the same household sitting together.*
- *Physical Distancing: If you live in the same house please share the same seat, otherwise stay 2 metres apart, this means two people (one at each end) in a longer seat or one person only in a shorter seat.*
- *Please follow the directions of the Stewards to ensure the health and safety of everybody*

Stay the Course

With the incidence of corona virus again rising it is vital that we continue to follow the guidelines given by the public health authorities; especially by

- limiting social contacts,
- keeping the physical distancing,
- washing hands
- wearing a face mask when indoors with a group of people.
