Corona Virus Level 5 Restrictions:

With Level 5 restrictions no public Masses or services are allowed in our churches, with the exception for funerals (10 people permitted) and weddings, (6 allowed).

Funerals: We are all asked to avoid any gatherings of people in order to stop the spread of the virus. We need to keep this in mind in the event of a funeral in the parish. If attending the cemetery, or standing along the roadside to express sympathy, the wearing of a mask and keeping a minimum of 2 metres physical distancing is vital.

Mass during the time of Restrictions:

Mass will continue to be celebrated privately and will be streamed live via parish webcams. Intentions from the Killeen Masses will be included in the Louisburgh Mass. These can be rescheduled, if people wish, for Killeen Church when the restrictions are lifted.

Corona Virus Safeguards in Church:

- There is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass.
- People over 70 years of age, and those with a health issue, are highly recommended not to attend places where numbers of people meet for any length of time, especially indoors.
- Absolute Maximum Capacity of either church is 50 People.
- Physical Distancing: If you live in the same house please share the same seat, otherwise stay 2 metres apart, this means two people (one at each end) in a longer seat or one person only in a shorter seat.
- You must wear a mask.
- Please follow the directions of the Stewards to ensure the health and safety of everybody

Although our liturgies have been greatly reduced by the corona virus pandemic, our thanks is still due to those who participated in the Christmas liturgies, and to those who helped prepare the churches for the Christmas.

Family members may be appointed as special Eucharistic Ministers to bring Holy Communion to an elderly or ill family member.

In that way we respect, honour, and preserve God's greatest gifts, health and life, and do all we can to protect the vulnerable among us.
