Best Wishes to Archbishop Michael Neary who has formally submitted his resignation to the Vatican, in line with Church Law making it mandatory for bishops to do so on reaching the age of 75. Archbishop Neary has served in the role for 26 years. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Tuam in 1992 and was appointed Archbishop of Tuam in January 1995.

He will continue to serve in the position until his successor is appointed by Pope Francis.

Monthly Calls: The monthly calls to the sick and housebound by Fr Long were suspended as it is best practice not to have a person visiting multiple homes, and so risk spreading the virus to vulnerable people. However, if anybody wishes Fr Long to visit, or to receive Holy Communion or the sacrament of the sick, please phone 66198 and arrangements will be made for an individual visit, taking all advised precautions. The Irish Bishops have announced an initial submission phase of the Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland.
