Synod of Irish Church: The Irish Bishops have announced it has proposed to hold a Synod for the Catholic Church in Ireland within the next five years. The initial two-year phase of embarking on the synodal pathway and leading, in time, to a National Synod, helpfully coincides with preparation for the 2022 Ordinary General Assembly of Bishops in Rome entitled, For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.

Bishops envisage the next two years as a period of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a nationwide consultative conversation on this theme.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

A letter from An Taoiseach's office has indicated that First Holy Communion and Confirmation ceremonies may go ahead from 05 July, but in strict accordance with public health guidelines and current restrictions on the numbers allowed in church.

"Public health advice is that special religious followed by a hike up Killadoon Hill for the ceremonies, including First Holy Communions and children – no penance for the young! In line with the gradual reopening of society, from 5 July onwards, these ceremonies may take place while complying with Covid-19 guidance but ideally, where possible, should be rescheduled for the Autumn when it will be safer to do so.

The more serious concerns relate to the social gatherings which typically follow these sacraments. It should be stressed to families that these events must be planned in line with prevailing public health advice on household mixing and indoor and outdoor gatherings, for the health and safety of all concerned."

Confirmation: As a result of An Taoiseach's letter we can go ahead with Confirmation in small groups, as we had hoped to do before Easter.

It is proposed to go ahead on Saturdays in July and August with Fr. Long as celebrant.

There are some Saturdays where there are weddings booked so on those weeks the Confirmations will be celebrated on the Friday.

Some families may have plans made for the summer and the date given may not suit; if necessary a swap may be arranged with another family. If any family prefers to wait until the autumn a date can be arranged.

First Holy Communion: From 05 July, Monday to Friday each week, as long as overall numbers are kept with the physical distancing guidelines, it will be possible to have a small family gathering with a child receiving their First Holy Communion at the daily Mass at 11.00 a.m. (the time is to facilitate a funeral if it arises being held at 1.30 or 2.00 p.m.)

Alternatively, a family may wait and hope that there will be an opportunity for a larger gathering in the autumn. There can be no guarantee of this.

A family may decide to wait and have their child join next year's first Holy Communion group.
