Safety on the Water this Summer – RNLI

- 1. Check the weather forecast and tide times before you head out.
- 2. Always tell someone where you're going and when you'll be back.
- 3. If you see someone in trouble call 999 or 112 and ask for the coastguard.
- 4. Always carry a mobile phone and keep it on you at all times – use a waterproof pouch when going in the water.
