End of Covid Restrictions

As we begin to think of a return to (near normal) public worship, from 22 October, there are a lot of issues that we will have to face as a parish community.

Firstly, how many people will actually want to return to Mass and the prospect of sharing indoor space with larger numbers. Many might decide it is still too early to do so for them. We will have to give due consideration to the best use of the resources and volunteers we have so we can celebrate meaningful liturgies and worship without it becoming a burden on a few having to shoulder the responsibility of ministry too frequently.

We will need to consider how to revitalise the organising committees of the parish, Finance, Property Maintenance and Pastoral Council with a view to the near future where they will have a much increased role in the day to day running of the parish. Also, the schedule of Eucharistic Ministers, Readers and Stewards / Collectors will need to be updated and revised.

When restrictions end there is little point in wishing or thinking that everything will just return to how it was. Time has passed and this pandemic has brought much change in ourselves, and in how we act and behave.

What we will have to decide is how we deal with the new reality that we will face, in order to be a living Christian Community.
