Prevention of COVID 19

Anybody with any covid, flu-like, or cold-like symptoms, cough, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, temperature, lack of smell etc. should <u>not</u> attend church and should phone their G.P. for advice.

Corona Virus: Numbers allowed in Churches:

"religious services and weddings can proceed without capacity limits but with all other protective measures remaining in place." One of these protective measures is the requirement for 2 metres physical distancing between people, or between a group of people that live in the same house and others. This distancing imposes limits on the number of people in church.

So, if planning a wedding, funeral, or any other service in either of our churches in Kilgeever parish, until this requirement is changed numbers will be severely limited as at present.

Holy Communion for those with Coeliac disease If those with coeliac disease wish to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine, they should inform the priest, or ask one of the stewards to do so, before Mass.

Local Cemeteries: November is a month when we remember our dead in a special way. Our cemeteries are unique and very special places where our loved ones are laid to rest.

In Louisburgh a voluntary steering group has been busy looking at ways to enhance, preserve and maintain Kilgeever Old & New Cemeteries & St. Catherine's Cemetery into the future.

The steering group will work closely with Mayo County Council, local representatives, County Mayo Heritage Officer, landowners, Parish Priest, Cemetery Care Takers, Louisburgh Community Futures, Louisburgh Area Men's Shed, Louisburgh-Killeen Heritage, Undertakers and many other stakeholders.

Some essential drainage works have already begun on site at Kilgeever New Cemetery. Finding marked graves is now easier due to a new map board at the gate but also available online. New footpaths have been laid and there are plans to continue this.

A 'Go Fund Me' Page - Kilgeever Cemetery Development Plan- has been set up to help with costs.

For those not online, a special envelope available in the church porch, can be used and returned with the weekly church donations or dropped in the letter box at the Parish Priest's House. Please do not leave donations in the church.

Advent 2021: The season of Advent begins next Sunday, 28 November. We don't need to be reminded that this year Advent and Christmas are again going to be very different. This does not mean that we don't celebrate the birth of Jesus, just that we may have to do it differently. Rather than complain about what we cannot do at present, why not concentrate on all that is possible. We can bring the focus of Advent and Christmas back where it rightly belongs, on the birth of Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God with us.

Waiting has always been the theme of Advent. Waiting for, and anticipating, and preparing for the birth of Jesus, has always been the purpose of Advent. The Advent Wreath has become a powerful reminder and symbol of our need to prepare, and of the shortness of time to do so.

Traditionally, the wreath is made of four candles in a circle of evergreens. Each day, the candles are lighted, one candle the first week, and then another each succeeding week until Christmas. A short prayer usually accompanies the lighting.
