Lifting of Corona Virus Restrictions.

Following the public health announcement that the two-metre physical distancing is no longer a requirement there are now no restrictions on the number of people who may attend Mass and other services in our churches.

Prevention of COVID 19; While restrictions have been lifted the virus is still being transmitted in community and we must all do what we can to prevent those who are vulnerable getting infected and potentially becoming very ill.

- It is absolutely essential that everyone attending Mass or services in church must wear a mask covering nose & mouth at all times. Not to do so shows disrespect for the health and life of all others in church.
- Please use the hand sanitisers on entry to the church.
- •We will not, as of yet, resume the use of the holy water fonts and will still omit the sign of peace at Mass, as well as the reception of Holy Communion under both species.
- Holy Communion will still only be given into the hand.
- You are asked to use your own common sense when picking a seat in church and avoid crowding together as much as possible. Use all the space that is available.
- Anybody with any covid, flu-like, or cold-like symptoms, cough, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, temperature, lack of smell etc. should not attend church but should isolate and phone their G.P. for advice and seek a PCR test. You must isolate while awaiting PCR test results.
- Ventilation of Churches: In order to reduce the risk of spreading the corona virus, an airborne virus, the churches are ventilated as best we can when congregations are present. To facilitate airflow windows and doors are open when possible.
- Please, do not close doors if they are open when you enter the church.

Holy Communion for those with Coeliac disease

If those with coeliac disease wish to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine, they should inform the priest, or one of the stewards, <u>before</u> Mass.

Arrangements will be made for them to receive Holy Communion safely without having to share a chalice with any other person.

Planning Your Wedding in Church?

The Catholic Church has certain requirements that \underline{must} be met before a marriage can be celebrated.

N.B. Bookings of weddings are provisional until all of these requirements have been met.

All documentation should be completed at least eight weeks before the date of the wedding.

Requirements

- Give at least **three months notice** to the priest where the marriage is to be celebrated.
- Produce <u>recently issued</u> Baptismal and Confirmation Certificates.
- Fill a **Pre-Nuptial Enquiry Form** with a priest, *preferably in the parish where you now live*.
- Establish your freedom to marry. This can be done by getting a 'Letter of Freedom' from the parishes where you lived for more than six months as adults. or A 'Statement of Freedom to Marry' may be made by parents or siblings and attested to before a priest. or

You may make a Statutory Declaration by swearing an 'Affidavit' before a Commissioner of Oaths or Solicitor asserting that you have never married. If you live outside of Ireland you <u>will</u> have to swear an affidavit asserting that you have never married.

- Produce a Certificate of Attendance at a Marriage Preparation Course.
- If one of the parties is not a baptised catholic the catholic party will need to be granted a 'dispensation' by the bishop. All other documentation must be completed before this can be done.

Unless you have been resident in Louisburgh Parish for all of your life, and never lived anywhere else, the preferred method of establishing your freedom to marry is by signed affidavit.

Civil Legal Aspects of Church Weddings

The State has its own requirements before it will recognise a marriage as a valid and legal civil marriage. Please contact the
