# Lifting of Corona Virus Restrictions.

Following the public health announcement that the two-metre physical distancing is no longer a requirement there are now no restrictions on the number of people who may attend Mass and other services in our churches.

**Prevention of COVID 19;** While restrictions have been lifted the virus is still being transmitted in community and we must all do what we can to prevent those who are vulnerable getting infected and potentially becoming very ill.

- It is absolutely essential that <u>everyone</u> attending Mass or services in church <u>must wear</u> <u>a mask covering nose & mouth at all times</u>. Not to do so shows disrespect for the health and life of all others in church.
- Please use the hand sanitisers on entry to the church.
- We will not, as of yet, resume the use of the holy water fonts and will still omit the sign of peace at Mass, as well as the reception of Holy Communion under both species.
- Holy Communion will still only be given into the hand.
- You are asked to use your own common sense when picking a seat in church and avoid crowding together as much as possible. Use all the space that is available.
- Anybody with any covid, flu-like, or cold-like symptoms, cough, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, temperature, lack of smell etc. should not attend church but should isolate and phone their G.P. for advice and seek a PCR test. You must isolate while awaiting PCR test results.
- Ventilation of Churches: In order to reduce the risk of spreading the corona virus, an airborne virus, the churches are ventilated as best we can when congregations are present. To facilitate airflow windows and doors are open when possible.
- Please, do not close doors if they are open when you enter the church.

## 01 February, Blessing of St. Bridget's Crosses:

May these crosses be a sign of our sharing in the Paschal Mystery of your Son and signify your protection of our lives, our land and its creatures. Through St. Brigid's intercession, during the coming year and always, may the blessing of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, be on this cross, on the hands that made it and on our home where it hangs. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

#### 02 February, Candlemas:

At the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple he was revealed as the light to enlighten all nations. Candles will be blessed at Mass.

"Bless these candles and make them holy. Loving God, accept the prayers of your people, who will use these candles

in praise of your name, that they may walk in the path of goodness until they reach that light which never fails."

Blessing of Throats.

The annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. This blessing is ordinarily given during Mass, on 03 February, the feast of Saint Blaise. Due to the corona virus the blessing will not be

given individually in church this year but will be given as a general blessing at the end of Mass.

Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His cult spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat.

Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver us from every disease of the throat, and from all other illness, especially at this time from covid 19: in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
