Prevention of COVID 19

Offertory Collection - Baskets: In the early stages of the corona virus pandemic it was advised that the passing around of the baskets at the offertory of the Mass, and the use of holy water fonts, be discontinued.

There was then a fear that the virus could be spread by touching objects that the virus was on. With a better understanding of the science of how this virus spreads, being airborne in tiny particles, it is now known that the risk of picking it up by touching objects is very low. We have been using the holy water fonts since Easter.

With most restrictions lifted, though there is still the HSE advice to wear a mask in congregated settings, it has been decided to re-introduce the passing of the baskets at the Offertory of the Mass.
