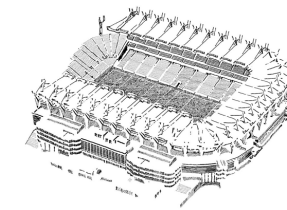
Prevention of COVID 19: It is wise to take precautions to prevent the spread of the virus. Covid 19 is still a very serious disease for many people with long term consequences.
