Archbishop Francis Duffy speaking on Reek Sunday – some points from his homily;

- The Synodal Process is a pathway not a runway; There are no quick fix solutions or approaches as we reflect on and consider our Church.
- We must not lose hope. We have the Lord with us and He will lead us through this time of transition and restructuring.
- The one certainty is the ongoing and sustained decline both in the numbers who practice and in the numbers of those who answer the Lord's call to priesthood and religious life.
- I suggest you look at your priest, he may be the last in a long line of resident pastors and may not be replaced.
- I suggest you look at your church, you may be lucky to have a Sunday Mass, but for how much longer?
- I suggest you look at your fellow parishioners at Mass, who among your neighbours will continue to be the new leaders and carry on pastoral work in your parish, alongside a much smaller number of clergy? Who among them will lead prayer services and keep faith alive and active through catechesis and other initiatives?
- This is a time for faith, faith into action, faith into reaching out.
