The parish can then claim back the income tax you have already paid on your contributions. It costs you nothing.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation 2023

Thanks to those parents who have already registered their children to receive these sacraments in 2023 - details on how to do so were in a letter sent before the summer holidays. You may do so by emailing louisburghparish@icloud.com with the details required.

We hope to be able to organise, in September, a preparation programme for these sacraments that will run over a number of months. If you have not already replied please do so without delay. All who have registered will be contacted by email about these programmes. It can no longer be presumed that all children automatically receive these sacraments when attending our parish schools, it does involve a choice, decision and commitment by parents and their families.
