Sacrament of Confirmation, Friday 03 March 2023.

Archbishop Duffy has published his schedule for Confirmation for 2023. Due to the number of children to be confirmed in the parish in 2023 Archbishop Duffy will confer the Sacrament in both Killeen Church and Louisburgh Church on Friday 03 March 2023.

Enrolment for 'You Shall be my Witnesses' preparation programme for Confirmation will take place at Killeen and Louisburgh Masses on Sunday 09 October. All children and their families will be welcomed by our parish community as they continue on their faith journey.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are usually celebrated in Killeen or Louisburgh churches on Saturday afternoons. The arrangement is that if more than one baptism is booked for that day that they will be celebrated together at the time the first one was booked for. Many parishes now have a set day in the month for Baptisms but up to this we have been able to accommodate parents as to when the sacrament is held, but it is a situation that will have to be kept under review. Baptism is the sacrament that celebrates a person's admission into the Christian community and it is thought to be more appropriate to have it as a community rather than a private ceremony.
