Worship in the absence of a priest - Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion

When a priest is not available to lead the community in worship it does not mean that the community does not gather to worship.

If it did, the vast majority of Catholics in many countries would gather to worship on only a handful of occasions throughout the year.

We remember the words of Jesus, "when two or three gather in my name I am there with them". The gathering together of Christians in his name makes Christ present.

When a priest is not available in our parish, as at present because of covid, we still can gather in the name of Jesus, we can proclaim the Word of God by reading the scriptures and share in the Sacrament of the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion consecrated at a previous celebration of the Eucharist.

On these occasions we use the Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion, a liturgy approved by the bishops of Ireland in the 1970s.

Holy Communion for those with Coeliac disease; please inform the priest before Mass if you wish to receive Holy Communion the form of bread with minimal gluten content, or under the form of wine.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays from 10.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. in Louisburgh Church. If we are to continue with adoration volunteers will be needed to expose and repose the Blessed Sacrament.

Enrolment for 'You Shall be my Witnesses' preparation programme for Confirmation will take place at Killeen and Louisburgh Masses this Sunday 09 October. All children and their families will be welcomed by our parish community as they continue on their faith journey.
