Worship in the absence of a priest - Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion

When a priest is not available to lead the community in worship it does not mean that the community does not gather to worship.

If it did, the vast majority of Catholics in many countries would gather to worship on only a handful of occasions throughout the year.

We remember the words of Jesus, "when two or three gather in my name I am there with them". The gathering together of Christians in his name makes Christ present.

When a priest is not available in our parish, we still can gather in the name of Jesus, we can proclaim the Word of God by reading the scriptures and share in the Sacrament of the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion consecrated at a previous celebration of the Eucharist.

On these occasions we use the Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion, a liturgy approved by the bishops of Ireland in the 1970s.

Holy Communion for those with Coeliac disease; please inform the priest before Mass if you wish to receive Holy Communion the form of bread with minimal gluten content, or under the form of wine.

Pope Francis: On the 60th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis encouraged Catholics to leave behind criticism and anger and to live their faith with joy.

"May the Church be overcome with joy. If she should fail to rejoice, she would deny her very self, for she would forget the love that begot her," the pope said during Mass in St. Peter's Basilica on 11 October.

"Yet," he continued, "how many of us are unable to live the faith with joy, without grumbling and criticizing? A Church in love with Jesus has no time for quarrels, gossip, and disputes. May God free us from being critical and intolerant, harsh, and angry. This is not a matter of style but of love.

For those who love, as the Apostle Paul teaches, do everything without murmuring."
