Prevention of COVID 19 – Most Recent Advice:

- The HSE's Chief Clinical Officer has urged people to wear masks in any crowded areas, or in the company of an older person, after a "significant and worrying" rise in Covid and Flu cases in only the last number of days.
- The Chief Medical Officer has echoed the comments, urging vulnerable people to wear masks when attending religious services over the Christmas period.
- Everyone attending Mass or services in our churches is encouraged to wear a mask covering nose & mouth at all times.
- Use the hand sanitisers on entry to the church.
- Anybody with any covid, flu-like, or cold-like symptoms, should not attend church.

Grow in Love - You Shall be my Witnesses: Those preparing for the sacraments of first Eucharist and Confirmation will be participating in our Masses on Sunday 22 January.

Perfection not Needed!

We do not have to be perfect to live in a way that gives witness to Christ and attracts others to him, according to Pope Francis.

At his weekly public audience on 11 January, Francis reflected on Jesus' calling of St. Matthew, then a tax collector, to follow him as one of his 12 apostles.

"Here is the message for us: we do not have to wait until we are perfect and have come a long way following Jesus to witness to him; no, our V. The Angel of the Lord declared unto proclamation begins today, there where we live," he said.

"And it does not begin by trying to convince others, but by witnessing every day to the beauty of the Love that has looked upon us and lifted us up," he said.

"We can ask ourselves: how do we look upon others? How often do we see their faults and not their needs; how often do we label people by what they do or think," he said.

"Even as Christians we say to ourselves: is he one R. Be it done unto me according to your word. of us or not? This is not the gaze of Jesus: He always looks at each person with mercy."

"And Christians," Pope Francis said, "are called to do as Christ did, looking like him, especially at the so-called 'distant ones.' Indeed, Matthew's V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. account of the call ends with Jesus saying, 'I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."
