In October 2021 the Catholic Church's synodal process began. This was the first time that a worldwide listening process and consultation with parishes and dioceses was attempted.

For the first time ever, seven continental assemblies took place across five continents so each continent could gather and respond once more to the Universal Church with these reflections.

The European Continental Assembly, was held from 5 to 9 February in Prague this year and the Irish delegation consisted of four in-person delegates and ten online delegates. There were 200 people present at the Prague assembly from 45 different European countries and a further 390 delegates online.

Each continental assembly then sent their reflections to the synod office in Rome and a working document called *Instrumentum Laboris* was prepared and published recently. This document is the official working document for the Synod of Bishops, which is taking place in Rome from 4 to 29 October this year and in October 2024.
