<u>Facemasks</u> are available at the doors of our churches for all who may wish to wear them; many do so in crowded settings because of an underlying medical condition or because of a compromised immune system.

For the moment the sign of peace will not be reintroduced at Mass.

All are requested to continue to receive Holy Communion in the hand, and so avoid any possible risk of salvia, and possibly a virus, being passed on to another person on the fingers of the Eucharistic Minister.

As part of Heritage Week on Thursday, 17 August at 10.30 am, biologists from Inland Fisheries Ireland along with Dr. Ken Whelan, the worldrenowned salmon biologist, will be on the bank of the Bunabhann River beside the bridge in Louisburgh.

They will be taking live samples of fish and insects from the water and placing them temporarily in small tanks to demonstrate the amazing diversity of life in our rivers. This will be engaging for adults and children alike.
