**Rivers Day Louisburgh:**  
 As part of Heritage Week on Thursday, 17 August  
 at 10.30 am, biologists from Inland Fisheries  
 Ireland along with Dr. Ken Whelan, the world-  
 renowned salmon biologist, will be on the bank  
 of the Bunabhann River beside the bridge in  
 Louisburgh.

They will be taking live samples of fish and  
 insects from the water and placing them  
 temporarily in small tanks to demonstrate the  
 amazing diversity of life in our rivers. This will be  
 engaging for adults and children alike.

After this, around 12.00 p.m. there will be a  
 fascinating talk by Ken who has just completed  
 an ecological study of two of the area's principal  
 rivers, the Carrowniskey and the Ballykip.

The talk will outline the main findings as to the  
 well-being of the two rivers and  
 recommendations are expected to focus on flood  
 prevention and maximising financial benefits for  
 farmers through participation in nature-friendly  
 projects.

The study was commissioned by Climate Action  
 Louisburgh Locality (CALL) and has been  
 generously supported by the Local Authorities  
 Water Programme.
