First Communion 2024

Louisburgh, Sunday 12 May, 2024 Killeen, Sunday 19 May, 2024

As part of the second-class religious education programme in our two parish schools children will be prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist in 2024.

However, it is entirely the decision of parents if their children will receive these sacraments and participate in the school religious education programme. That decision will be respected by parish and school.

While we are very fortunate in our parish to have excellent schools with committed teachers who prepare the children for these Sacraments, it is primarily the home that provides the most important influence for children in the area of faith formation.

The 'Grow in Love' parish programme has been used in our parish for the past few years to help parents become more actively involved in the preparation for these Sacraments.

With the co-operation of parents and children it is hoped to run the 'Grow in Love' programme at selected Sunday Masses in both churches in the parish during the year.

There will be an initial meeting for all parents of children preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist early in the new school year to organise the programme.

The children will have completed their preparation in school and in the parish 'Grow in Love' programme by the start of May 2024.

Provisionally, we have set 19 May 2024 for First Communion in Killeen, and 12 May 2024 for First Communion in Louisburgh.

These celebrations will follow the traditional pattern but being conscious that not everyone now wishes such a celebration, there is also the option for parents to bring their child to any Sunday Mass during the month of May to receive their first communion.

To facilitate the organising of the First Holy Communion parish preparation programme it is asked that parents register their child on the form they have received via the schools.

Covid / Transmissible Viruses:

With Covid cases again very noticeably on the rise all are asked to exercise caution out of respect to those who are vulnerable to this disease. Covid remains a serious threat to the life and health of those who are vulnerable.

Hand Sanitiser is available at the entrances to the churches and all are requested to use it.

Facemasks are available at the doors of our churches for all who may wish to wear them; many do so in crowded settings because of an underlying medical condition or because of a compromised immune system.

For the moment the sign of peace will not be reintroduced at Mass.

All are requested to continue to receive Holy Communion in the hand, and so avoid any possible risk of salvia, and possibly a virus, being passed on to another person on the fingers of the Eucharistic Minister.

Killeen Community Council Elections will take place in September. Everyone over 18 and resident in the community is eligible to vote and stand for election. Voting slips will be delivered to each household from Friday 15 September and collected by Friday 22 September.
