# Covid / Flu / RSV / Transmissible Viruses:

Covid and other viruses remain a serious threat to the life and health of those who are vulnerable. All are asked to exercise caution out of respect to those who are vulnerable.

<u>Hand Sanitiser</u> is available at the entrances to the churches and all are requested to use it.

<u>Facemasks</u> are available at the doors of our churches for all who may wish to wear them; many do so in crowded settings because of an underlying medical condition or because of a compromised immune system, or they may be caring for such a person at home.

For the moment the sign of peace will not be reintroduced at Mass.

All are requested to continue to receive <u>Holy</u> <u>Communion in the hand</u>, and so avoid any possible risk of salvia, and possibly a virus, being passed on to another person on the fingers of the Eucharistic Minister.

<u>Communion under both species</u> will not be generally offered for the present; if requested, arrangements will be made for those with Coeliac Disease.

Coinnle ar Lasadh *Máirtín Ó Direáin 1939* 'Coinnle ar Lasadh' is a Christmas poem by the great Aran Island poet, Máirtín Ó Direáin that he dedicated to his mother.

It remembers the tradition on the Aran Islands of lighting twelve candles on the 5<sup>th</sup> of January, Oíche Chinn an Dá Lá Dhéag, the eve of the twelfth day of Christmas, the eve of the Epiphany.
