Covid and other viruses remain a serious threat to the life and health of those who are vulnerable. All are asked to exercise caution out of respect to those who are vulnerable.

Hand Sanitiser is available at the entrances to the churches and all are requested to use it.

Facemasks are available at the doors of our churches for all who may wish to wear them; many do so in crowded settings because of an underlying medical condition or because of a compromised immune system, or they may be caring for such a person at home.

For the moment the sign of peace will not be reintroduced at Mass.

All are requested to continue to receive Holy Communion in the hand, and so avoid any possible risk of saliva, and possibly a virus, being passed on to another person on the fingers of the Eucharistic Minister.

Communion under both species will not be generally offered for the present; if requested, arrangements will be made for those with Coeliac Disease.

Louisburgh Church Building – Dampness

The interior of Louisburgh Church was last painted in 2012, having previously been painted in 2003.

As all are well aware the interior, especially the South facing wall, has suffered considerably from dampness in the intervening period, a problem that seems to be worsening with the increased rainfall in recent years.

Until something can be done to alleviate the problem with water ingression, and the resulting dampness, there is little point in again painting the interior.

When this report is ready it will be presented to the Parish Finance Committee who will then discuss it with a view to drawing up a schedule of
