### **Understanding Synodality**

As we have listened to the voice of the Spirit in "A synodal Church is a Church where all the preparation for the Universal Synod, and as we baptised feel engaged." (Cardinal Mario Grech, discern the path ahead for the Church in Ireland, Secretary General of the Synod of Bishops). there is an emerging sense that we are beginning a journey. When we move beyond the idea of the synodal pathway as "something we have to do", we realise that this is not something of our own initiative. It is God who is calling us to make this journey. It is his initiative.

At the beginning of this process in 2021, synodality was an unfamiliar term to many people in the Catholic Church. Two years on the level of awareness and understanding is growing It is a departure from what is familiar.
