Jubilee Year of Hope 2025

Archbishop Francis will open the Jubilee Year of Hope at the annual Mass for Peace in Tuam Cathedral on Wednesday 1st January 2025, at noon.

In his letter "Hope does not Disappoint", introducing the Jubilee of Hope, Pope Francis writes "The coming Jubilee will thus be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God. May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require, in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation".

One of the features of the Jubilee of Year of Hope is an emphasis on popular piety, such as places of pilgrimage and wayside shrines, both strongly associated with this diocese. In addition, there are local shrines, patterns, holy wells, Knock, Ballintubber Abbey, Croagh Patrick and of course our churches, prayers and practices.

May we experience the joy of being 'pilgrims of hope' during the coming year.

As the dawn breaks on a new year, let us give thanks for all we hold dear: our health, our family and our friends. Let us release our grudges, our anger and our pains, for these are nothing but binding chains. Let us live each day in the most loving ways, the God-conscious way. Let us serve all who are in need, regardless of race, colour or creed. Let us keep God in our hearts and to call on God's name each day. Let us lead the world from darkness to light, from falsehood to truth and from wrong to right. Let us remember that we are all one, embracing all, discriminating against none. May your year be filled with peace and love. May God's blessings shower upon you and bestow upon each of you a bright, healthy and peaceful new year.
