Drop-In Listening **Service:** At Counselling Centre we offer a confidential single session listening service with no appointment needed. Our Drop-In listening service is now available on Thursdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Tax rebate on donations to voluntary bodies: If you are a PAYE worker who uses the weekly envelopes to make your donation to the parish it is possible for the parish to claim back from the revenue commissioners the tax you have already paid on your donations. The total donated has to amount to more than €250 in the year, (€5 a week, and most already give more than that).

Over the coming weeks all who donated more than this amount during 2024 should receive a form, CHY2, in the post. If you pay tax under the PAYE scheme please fill it out and return it to the church or to Fr. Long. The parish can then claim back the tax you have already paid on your contributions.

For example, a person paying <u>PAYE</u> tax at 20%; if they give the minimum to qualify, €250, the parish would get back €62.50, and with a person paying tax paying tax at 42% the parish would receive €181.

If you are <u>self-employed</u> you can claim relief for yourself on your tax return and hopefully this might encourage you to give a little extra. For example, a self employed person who paid tax at 42% who gave €500 last year to the parish, (€10 a week) is allowed relief of €210, if they claim on their return, and so their outlay is in effect only €290. (€5.57 per week)

It is a way we can maximise donations to help build up a fund for future projects in our parish.

All records of contributions to the parish are confidential and will only be used to claim back tax from the revenue commissioners, if you express your willingness by signing the form. This information will not be divulged to anyone else and is protected under the Data Protection Act. The parish is registered with the Data Protection Commissioner.
