The canonization of Carlo Acutis, the Catholic Church's first millennial saint, will take place on September 07. Acutis, an Italian teenager who died from leukaemia in 2006, will be declared a saint by Leo at a ceremony in St. Peter's Square expected to be attended by thousands of young people. Acutis was just 15 when he died, but during his short life he used his computing skills to spread awareness of the Catholic faith by setting up a website that documented reports of miracles. Pope Leo will canonize Acutis in September 07, along with another youthful saint, Pier Giorgio Frassatti, who died in 1925 at age 24. Acutis, nicknamed God's influencer, has developed a strong following among young Catholics and beyond. The British-born Italian teenager, who loved video-gaming, is often depicted wearing jeans and trainers, making him a relatable figure to a new generation of Catholics.
