Those of you who are able to stand;

Please Stand, As the celebrant /priest Says " Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours...." and remain standing to respond, " May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands ..."
The celebrant invites you to stand at this point in the Holy Mass to pray the "offertory prayer" also referred to as the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer because
This, is the High Point of the Holy Mass , where we offer ourselves to God our Heavenly Father through the gifts of bread, wine and collection. This is part of the church rubric was one of the changes implemented by the Novas Ordo in 1979 with the purpose of encouraging increased active participation by the congregation.

Standing is a sign of Respect and Honour. Standing symbolises our faith in Christ. We stand with Him THROUGH our faith in Him as participating members of His Church.
When we stand for prayer we assume our full stature before God, not in pride , but in humble gratitude for the marvellous thing God has done in creating and redeeming each one of us .
Standing unites the congregation with the celebrant and the church prayer.
By Baptism we have been given a share in the life of God and the posture of standing is an acknowledgement of this wonderful gift.

The Presentation of the Lord: Candlemas: (Monday 02 Feb.) is a traditional Christian festival that commemorates the ritual purification of Mary 40 days after the birth of her son. It also marks the presentation of the infant Jesus in the temple. Christians were observing this holiday in Jerusalem as early as the 4th Century A.D. Candlemas is a cross quarter day, halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. Many northern European pagans (persons who were not Christian, Jewish or Muslim) celebrated in various ways on the quarter days and cross quarter days. The early Christians made a big celebration out of Candlemas which gave new Christian converts something else to do when they might otherwise have been tempted to revert to pagan tradition. Candles were lit on this day to symbolize that Jesus Christ was the light, the truth and the way. Eventually it became the day on which the year's supply of candles for the church were blessed. The Feast of Purification is called *Candlemas* because of that.
